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#### Foreword

From amongst the duties we have towards the Glorious Qur'ān is to recite it regularly and abundantly. The tilāwah (recitation) of the Qur'ān alone is also a right of the Qur'ān upon each and every believer, whether he understands it or not.

However, it is of utmost importance that we ensure the correct recitation of the Glorious Qur'ān. Hadhrat Jibrail \*\* revealed the verses of the Glorious Qur'ān in a specific manner upon our beloved Nabi \*\*. And our beloved Nabi \*\* recited these verses in that exact manner before the Sahābah \*\*.

Since then, a constant effort has ensured the preservation of this level of recitation. Hence, it is necessary that every believer educates himself with the rules of Tajweed and implements them during recitation. May it not be that our neglect of Tajweed leaves us in a situation where the recitation of the Glorious Qur'ān draws the anger of Allāh upon us instead of his mercy.

Here at Madrasah Baytul Ilm, the subject of Tajweed is taught to the students from an early age and an effort is made to maintain, in fact advance this ability as the children grow older. Alhamdulillāh, only through the fadhl of Allāh, many years ago I penned down some rules and terms of Tajweed in their very basic form to help our young students in the early years of Madrasah. Māshā' Allāh, these notes have now been typed and published in a booklet to further extend its benefit.

This book will serve as a useful guide for young children, ideally aged 7 - 10 (in years 3 - 5 of the Madrasah). Along with this, those adults who are unfamiliar with the rules of Tajweed and wish to make a start, may also benefit from this booklet.

May Allāh Ta'ālā make this booklet a means of Sadaqah Jāriyah (continuous reward) for those involved in its preparation and a means of guidance for our beloved students, their families and all those who benefit from it. Āmeen.

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# **SÄKIN AND MUSHADDAD**

#### Noon Sākin

A Noon with a Jazm on it is known as Noon Sākin.



#### Meem Sākin

A Meem with a Jazm on it is known as Meem Sākin.



#### Noon Mushaddad

A Noon with a Tashdeed on it is known as Noon Mushaddad.



#### Meem Mushaddad

A Meem with a Tashdeed on it is known as Meem Mushaddad.



### **GHUNNAH**

Ghunnah is to recite a letter from the nose. There are two letters of Ghunnah:



Examples عَمْ

Note: The duration of Ghunnah is equivalent to one Alif. The duration of one Alif is equivalent to the time it takes to open a closed finger or close an open finger.

There are two more letters which are also recited with Ghunnah sometimes:

If Wow Mushaddad or Yā Mushaddad have a Noon Sākin or Tanween before it, they will be recited with Ghunnah.

Examples	لَهَبٍ وَّتَبَّ	أَنْ يَّنْكِحَ
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# 2 RULES OF NOON SÄKIN AND TANWEEN

#### Tanween

Letters with Two Zabar, Two Zer and Two Pesh are known as Tanween. Example:

Tanween sounds just like Noon Sākin. That is why Noon Sākin and Tanween have the same rules.

#### Rule Number 1

If after Noon Sākin or Tanween, any of the following letters appear:

then the Noon Sākin or Tanween will be recited without Ikhfā (nasal sound).

Examples	مَنُ الْمَنَ	عَلِيمٌ حَكِيمٌ
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If after Noon Sākin or Tanween, any of the above mentioned letters do not appear, then the Noon Sākin or Tanween will be recited with Ikhfā (nasal sound).

إِنْ كَانَ نَاصِيَةٍ كَاذِبَةٍ

Note: The sound of Ghunnah is more stronger and directly from the nose. The sound of Ikhfā is softer than Ghunnah and passes lightly through the nose.

# **2 RULES OF MEEM SÄKIN**

#### Rule Number 1

If after Meem Sākin, there is a  $\uparrow$  or a  $\checkmark$  ,then the Meem Sākin will be recited with Ghunnah.

إِلَيْكُم شُرْسَلُونَ يَعْتَصِمُ بِاللَّهِ Examples

#### Rule Number 2

If after Meem Sākin, there appears any letter other than  $\uparrow$  or  $\psi$ , the Meem Sākin will be recited without Ghunnah.

أَلَهُ يَجْعَلُ أَلَهُ تَرَ Examples

# **2 RULES OF THE LETTER LÂM**

#### Rule Number 1

If there appears a Zabar or Pesh before the Lām of the word Allāh, it will be recited with a full mouth.

Examples	رَسُوْلُ اللهِ	خَتَمَ اللَّهُ
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If there appears a Zer before the Lām of the word Allāh, it will be recited with an empty mouth.

Examples	عِنْدِ اللهِ	بِشمِراللهِ
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# **5 RULES OF THE LETTER RÃ**

#### Rule Number 1

If a Zabar or Pesh appears on the letter Rā, the letter Rā will be recited with a full mouth.

Examples	رُبَهَا	رَبُّك

#### Rule Number 2

If a Zer appears under the letter Rā, the letter Rā will be recited with an empty mouth.

Examples	رِجاَلٌ	إِضْرِب
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If the letter Rā is Sākin, it will be recited with a full mouth or empty mouth according to what is on the letter before it:

Letter Before Has	Recite Rā With	Example
Zabar	Full Mouth	بَرُقٌ
Pesh	Full Mouth	يُرُزَقُونَ
Zer	Empty Mouth	فِرُعَوْنَ

#### Rule Number 4

If the letter Rā is Mushaddad and has a Zabar or Pesh on it, it will be recited with a full mouth. If it has a Zer under it, it will be recited with an empty mouth.

Examples	ۮؙڔۣۜؿۣۘ	ٱلرَّحُمٰنُ
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#### Rule Number 5

If Rā becomes Sākin due to stopping on it, and before it is a Yā Sākin, the Rā will be recited empty mouth.

Examples	بَصِيْرُ	خَيُرُ
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### THE RULE OF QALQALAH

If any one of the following letters is Sākin, it will be pronounced with a slight echoing sound.

قد کی کی افغان کی ا

Note: An easy way to memorise these letters is to remember:

 قُطُبُ جَدِّ

# **7 LETTERS OF ISTI'LÃ**

These letters will always be recited with a full mouth. They are also known as Huroofe Musta'liyah.

اَلْمَخُضُوْبِ خَالِقٌ Examples

Note: An easy way to memorise these letters is to remember:

خُصَّ ضَغُطٍ قِظُ

### **3 RULES OF WAQF**

Wafq means to stop. When ending a verse of the Qur'an or stopping in between a verse to take a breath, Wagf must be made in the correct manner.

#### Rule Number 1

If a letter has a Zabar, Zer, Pesh, Do Zer, Do Pesh or Sākin, at the time of Waqf it will be read as Sākin.

#### Rule Number 2

If a letter has Do Zabar, at the time of Waqf it will be read with an Alif.

If the letter is a round Tā, at the time of Waqf it will be read as a Hā Sākin.

Examples	فِي الْحُطَمَةِ ﴿ فِي الْحُطَمَةُ
	نَارٌ حَامِيَةٌ ← نَارٌ حَامِيَة

#### Note

If Waqf has been made in between a verse, one should go back a word or two when restarting.

Also, recitation should not be restarted from the middle of a word.
